LICENSEE'S MOTION TO COMPEL

Pursuant to 10 C.F.R. § 2.740, the Sacramento Municipal Utility District ("Licensee" or the "District") hereby moves the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board for an order compelling Environmental and Resources Conservation Organization ("ECO") to respond immediately to "Licensee's First Set of Interrogatories and Requests for Production of Documents to ECO," served on May 13, 1994. The District also requests that the order warn ECO that any continued failure to respond to the District's May 13, 1994 discovery request, or any failure to respond to other discovery in this proceeding, will result in ECO's dismissal from this proceeding pursuant to 10 C.F.R. § 2.707.

Under the Commission's Rules of Practice, at 10 C.F.R. §

2.740b(b), ECO was required to respond to the District's interrogatories by June 1, 1994 (fourteen days after service by mail).

ECO neither responded nor made any attempt to notify either the Board or the parties to request an extension.

We telephoned ECO's Counsel's offices on June 6, and ECO's Counsel returned our call the next day. At that time, ECO's Counsel stated that he was having difficulty reaching Dr. Rossin. ECO's Counsel promised to provide ECO's response to the District's interrogatories by Friday, June 10, and to send a letter to the Board and parties notifying them of this commitment. However, no letter or response has been received from ECO.

ECO's lack of regard for its discovery obligations in this proceeding should not be tolerated. As the Commission has made clear, failure to respond to discovery is no mere procedural trifle.

Rather, it is the linchpin of the fact-finding process, for the ability of an adjudicator to arrive at the truth depends on the parties' willingness to produce relevant information and witnesses. When the parties refuse to meet that obligation, they cripple the adjudicators' ability to make sound and just decisions.

Long Island Lighting Co. (Shoreham Nuclear Power Station, Unit 1), CLI-89-2, 29 N.R.C. 211, 215 (1989).
