1. This Medical Center requests an upgrade of the authority of our License to a Specific License of Broad Scope. Our source of information is paragraph 1.4.3 on page 4 of the Regulatory Guide 10.8, Revision 2, August 1987.
2. Granting this authority will allow the Radiation Safety Committee to function to the full measure of the reference and will be the ideal method to manage our Research Building. We anticipate that future research will involve changing users, isotopes and room assignments from time to time. Note that all research is In-Vitro and that no human In-Vivo studies are performed in the Research Building.
3. We should remain in our current NRC License Fee Category (7C).


We notified you in the above mentioned letter that we would void your request if you did not respond to our notice within 30 days.

Dear Mr. Wright:

We have reviewed your letter dated January 5, 1993 (received January 10, 1994), requesting that your specific scope license be amended in its entirety to a broad scope license.

Be advised that broad scope licenses will be issued only to organizations which have:

1. Considerable prior experience in the use of radioactive materials under specific licenses of limited scope. Although not specified in the regulations, it is recommended that an applicant have had a limited specific license for at least a 5-year period.
2. A good regulatory performance record, based on NRC licensing and inspection of prior activities.
3. A radioactive materials utilization program of such scope that the organization requires a variety of radionuclides and the operational flexibility to cover numerous uses and users.
4. An administrative structure, organization and procedures adequate to ensure safe operations and to review and approve proposed uses, users, facilities, and procedures incorporated into the license.

A broad license is intended to accommodate those organizations involved in an extensive radioactive material program where the demand is great for a variety of radionuclides and uses. Therefore, it will be necessary for you to resubmit your request along with the information outlined in the enclosed draft Regulatory Guide 10.5, Revision 3 "Applications for Licenses of Broad Scope." Be advised that your request will require significant modifications to your current licensed program.

We will continue our review of your application upon receipt of this information. Please reply in duplicate, within 30 days, and refer to Control Number 96274.
