On August 31, 1983 License # 29-18207-01 for Cornell & Underhill, Inc. will expire. We do not wish to renew this license. However, we would like to reapply for a new license or transfer under Fabco Piping Inc., 1000 South Fourth Street, Harrison, N.J. 07029. Cornell & Underhill is now a sister company to Fabco Piping, Inc., both of which are wholly owned subsidiaries of Piping Industries Corporation. The operations of Cornell & Underhill have been terminated and Fabco is now our sole manufacturing arm. Therefore, our need for the license has switched in terms of company name and plant location.
