SUBJECT: EXPOSURE TO AMERICIUM-241

This is to provide an update on the americium-241 incident involving Gulf Nuclear, Inc., a Texas licensee.

As a result of the lawsuit filed by the licensee against the Texas Department of Health, a Texas judge issued a temporary injunction on March 29, 1983, barring certain actions by the Texas Department of Health and thus permitting continuing operations by the licensee.

Results reported by Oak Ridge National Laboratory (ORNL) regarding whole body counting indicate that four out of the seven employees tested have body burdens in the thorax region ranging from 15 to 234 nCi of americium-241. A medical consultant has been retained by the licensee to provide specialized treatment if desired by any of these employees.

The State is continuing its investigation of the incident, and is evaluating further enforcement actions available to the State. There continues to be media interest concerning the incident.

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
