## SUBJECT: LEAKING SHIPMENT OF RADIOACTIVE MATERIAL

A shipment of radioactive material from the General Atomic Company, en route to Barnwell, South Carolina, was observed leaking a liquid at a truck stop on Interstate 10 west of Las Cruces, New Mexico, on February 3, 1982. The driver identified the leak, roped off the area, and notified authorities. Shipping paper information indicates that the shipment contained 60 grams of natural uranium, 95 grams of uranium-235, 368 grams of thorium- 230 and 62 microcuries of solids. General Atomic and Chem Nuclear personnel are en route to the scene and will handle clean-up and repackaging as necessary. A State of New Mexico representative and a NRC Region IV inspector wiil also travel to the site and are expected to arrive late on February 4, 1982.

Region IV was notified by telephone by the State of New Mexico at 10:45 a.m., February 4, 1982.
