In each case where cameras were allowed, and where the Public Affairs Officer was present, there were no significant problems. Minor procedural misunderstandings on the part of individual host building security personnel were readily ironed out, as were problems by the news media bringing the wrong kind of mobile television cameras. I have had no report from any Licensing Board that had cameras cover a hearing of any problems associated with having the cameras in the hearing; nor have I had any reports that where cameras were excluded, the attempt to bring cameras into the hearing disrupted the hearing.

In reviewing this record, I can only come to the conclusion that allowing cameras under the conditions stated in the NRC policy during the trial period has proved workable and has imposed only minor and negligible perturbations on hearing procedures in this region. I recommend that the policy be continued on a permanent basis, recognizing that after the initial novelty of covering a particular hearing had worn off, the interest of the news media in camera coverage itself has declined drastically. I had no inquiries from camera people about the hearings in the last four months.
