Gentlemen:

SUBJECT: Completion of NRC Generic Letter 89-10 Actions

In Reference 2, licensees were required to notify the NRC in writing within 30 days of the completion of the actions described in the first paragraph of Item i of the Generic Letter. Omaha Public Power District (OPPD) completed all actions described in Item i on May 27, 1994 for Fort Calhoun Station. In addition, OPPD has established a Motor Operated Valve (MOV) Program which fulfills the requirements of the Generic Letter.

With regard to periodic verification of switch settings, OPPD will use dynamic testing until industry documentation exists to support an alternate method of verification. However, utilizing the guidance from the recently released Generic Letter 89-10, Supplement 6 (Reference 3), OPPD has elected to form two valve groups, one consisting of the eight High Pressure Safety Injection valves and the other consisting of the four Low Pressure Safety Injection valves, to be tested per the grouping criteria discussed in the supplement. A portion of the valves in each of these groups is to be dynamically tested and the remainder of each group is to be statically tested once every five years or three refueling outages, whichever is longer. This change has been incorporated into the Fort Calhoun Station Generic Letter 89-10 Test Program. All the valves contained in these two groups were dynamically tested with satisfactory results during the initial Generic Letter 89-10 Test Program.
