DUTIES OF VACANCY:

Responsibilities include: coordination of various divergent staff points of view, reconciliation of differences, presentation to Commission and NRC management staffs of issues and information related to the emergency preparedness program. Assists the Deputy Director in performing duties related to emergency preparedness.

QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED:

Expertise in the handling of a complex program with decentralized execution. Ability to absorb, analyze and coordinate issues. Knowledge of NRC organizations and programs and of regulatory policies and practices. Knowledge of technical and administrative aspects of licensee, national, state and local government emergency planning is desirable. Degree in engineering or scientific discipline is desirable.
