

NOTICE OF VIOLATION

During an NRC inspection conducted from November 15, through November 18, 1993, a violation of NRC requirements was identified. In accordance with the "General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions," 10 CFR Part 2, Appendix C, the violations are listed below:

10 CFR 35.33(a)(3) requires, in part, that the licensee shall notify the patient of a misadministration no later than 24 hours after its discovery.

10 CFR 35.33(a)(4) requires, in part, that if the patient was notified, the licensee shall also furnish, within 15 days of the misadministration, a written report to the patient by sending either:

- (i) A copy of the report that was submitted to the NRC; or
- (ii) A brief description of both the event and the consequences as they may affect the patient, provided a statement is included that the reported to the NRC can be obtained from the licensee.


Contrary to the above, as of March 15, 1993, and June 2, 1993, the licensee failed to furnish, within 15 days of misadministrations, a written report to the patient by sending a copy of the report that was submitted to the NRC or a brief description of both the event and the consequences as they may effect the patient.

This is a Severity Level IV violation (Supplement VI).

The inspection showed that steps had been taken to correct the identified violation and to prevent recurrence. Consequently, no reply to the violation is required and we have no further questions regarding this matter.
