
ORDER (Seeking Information on Document Copies and Costs)

Several Intervenors have asked us to reconsider our order concerning service on them of documents generated by the Applicants for Staff review in this proceeding. They argue that the burdens on them in not receiving individual copies of such documents outweigh costs to the Applicants.

In order to place this question in clearer perspective, the NRC Staff and Applicants are directed to supply the following information:

Question to the Staff.

1. How many copies of documents, such as amendments to the FSAR and answers to Staff questions, is the Staff requiring the Applicants to file in this case? Is the required number of copies the same for all OL reviews?



Questions for the Applicant.

- 1. In addition to the number of copies of documents you are filing with the Staff, how many copies are you making (1) for distribution to other State or Federal agencies, (2) for internal use, and (3) for other purposes, including extras?
- 2. What would be your incremental cost, per page, if you were directed to make four more copies of documents than you are making now? The Board's cost for xerox copying is less than \$.10 per page. If your cost is higher, please explain why.
- 3. What are your approximate handling and postage costs per Intervenor to serve, for example, a 20 page amendment to the FSAR?
- 4. Assume that from now until the conclusion of this case, you will be transmitting 2000 pages of material to the Staff for its review. What would be your approximate total cost in serving a copy of that material on all six Intervenors? You may revise the 2000 number up or down to reflect your best estimate. What approximate percentage of your estimated total costs for the licensing process would that represent?

This information should be served by December 15, 1982.
