PERSONS PRESENT:

The participants were: P. Nair and E. Tschoepe from the CNWRA, and G. Comfort, K. Hardin, B. Troskoski, and J. Furia from the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC). The list of all the attendees at the review is presented in Attachment A.

BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE OF TRIP:

The purpose of this trip was to attend presentations at the West Valley Demonstration Project (WVDP) concerning the "Review of Vitrification Safety Analysis." The WVDP Safety Analysis Report (SAR) on vitrification operations (SAR-003) has been drafted, and these presentations were made in anticipation of review of the draft SAR-003 by NRC and the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) Technical Review Group (TRG). The CNWRA will support NRC in this SAR review.

SUMMARY OF PERTINENT POINTS:

The meeting was conducted in two parts. The first two days were devoted to presentations by WVDP on vitrification systems and hardware, and the final day was restricted to NRC and DOE TRG personnel for discussions on the logistics of conducting the respective reviews of the SAR on Vitrification. The draft SAR was planned by WVDP to have been made available to reviewers at the meeting, but it was not ready at that time. The draft SAR was expected to be mailed the week of May 23, 1994.

Copies of viewgraphs from WVDP presentations are available from the authors of this report. A copy of the meeting agenda is attached. Presentations began with an overview of the process for treatment of HLW and an overview of the vitrification process and schedule. The WVDP schedule calls for the Safety Evaluation Report (SER) to be issued by NRC in the third quarter of FY95 and radioactive operations at the Vitrification Facility to begin in the second quarter of FY96 (ending in the third quarter of FY98).

Technical presentations covered the following details of the vitrification facility:

 WVNS vitrification process overview, including a comparison of the WVDP melter design with the design of the Defense Waste Processing Facility (DWPF) melter

- Canister turntable refurbishment and installation, including remote replacement of turntable motors with spares, if necessary
- High efficiency mist eliminator (HEME)
- Vitrification cell shielding design, including penetrations
- Tour of the vitrification and support facilities, including the cold chemical area, the vitrification facility, and the vitrification mock-up facility
- · Operations and HLW interim storage, including canister handling
- HLW transfer from the tank farm to the vitrification facility
- Process flow feed make-up, including the cold chemical system
- Off-gas processing, radiation protection program, and industrial hygiene and safety
- Industrial safety, emergency preparedness
- Safety envelope overview and classification (per DOE Std-1027-92 as Class 2)
- Training and qualifications standards
- Quality assurance (QA) program and classifications of vitrification components for QA and hazard category

During the tour of the vitrification plant and support facilities, it was noted that the inspection of the canister autogenous weld was planned to be a visual (video) inspection only. Also, the ventilation flow path from the Vitrification Plant included an elastomeric tube, apparently for seismic isolation.

The final meeting day was dedicated to a discussion of the logistics of a coordinated review by both the DOE TRG and NRC. Independence of the NRC review is required, and details of coordination as a result were not finalized during the meeting. The plan calls for the discussion of comments on the draft SAR-003 to be considered during a meeting tentatively scheduled for August 1994.

IMPRESSIONS AND CONCLUSIONS:

The schedule set by WVDP appears optimistic and may be affected by the TRG review process. Activities will be accelerating at WVDP, and NRC review activities are expected to accelerate accordingly. Technical details noted during the tour and identified above indicate that modifications to the facility and/or process may be needed.

PENDING ACTIONS:

The CNWRA will review the SAR-003 draft, which was received on May 27, 1994. CNWRA comments are expected to be forwarded through NRC by mid-summer, to accommodate potential coordination with TRG in August.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

The NRC/CNWRA should plan to attend future meetings with the TRG on coordination of review comments on the draft SAR-003 so that any issues dealing with radiological health and safety can be incorporated in the final SAR-003.
