



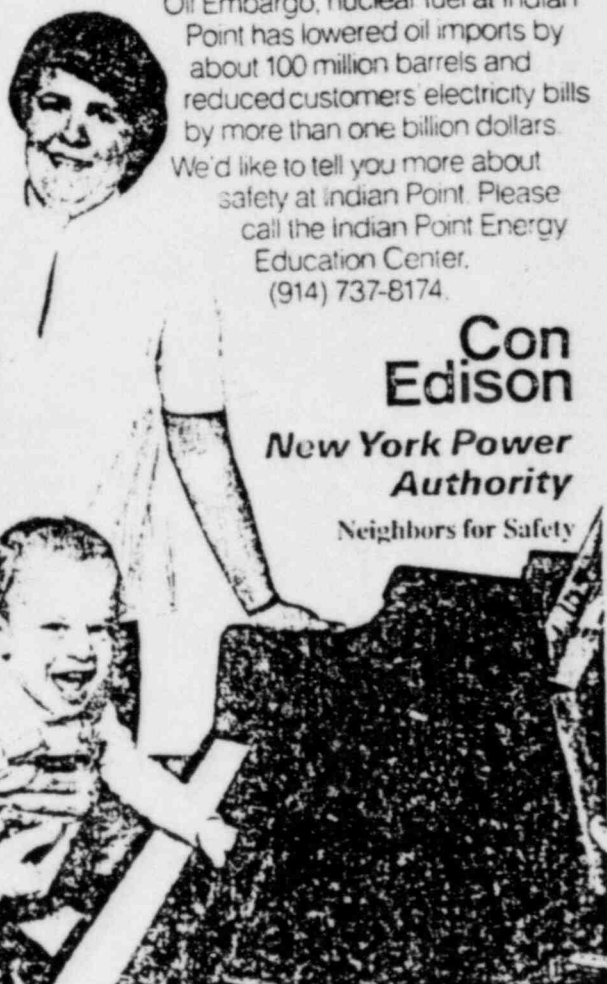
Power was first generated at Indian Point in 1962. Since then Indian Point has generated almost 75 billion kilowatt-hours of electricity without a single injury to the public. A lifelong resident of Westchester County, Bill Josiger has worked at Indian Point for the past 10 years. He coordinated the start-up test program for Unit 3 in 1976, and is responsible for its safe operation.
