NOTICE OF VIOLATION

During an NRC inspection conducted on January 14 and June 9, 1994, violations of NRC requirements were identified. In accordance with the "General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions," 10 CFR Part 2, Appendix C, the violation is listed below:

- A. 10 CFR 2.201 requires licensees to respond to Notices of Violation within the time specified in the notice. Two Notices of Violation were issued on July 30, 1987 and February 18, 1992. Those notices stated that "You are required to reply to this Notice within 30 days of the date above."

Contrary to the above, no response to these Notices of Violation were received by this office.

This is a Severity Level IV violation (Supplement VI).

- B. Condition No. 15 of NRC License No. 29-20937-02 requires that "The licensee shall conduct a physical inventory every 6 months to account for all sources and/or devices received and possessed under the license. Records of inventories shall be maintained for 5 years from the date of each inventory."

Contrary to the above, at the time of the inspection no inventory records were available and the staff indicated that no inventories were conducted.

This is a Severity Level IV violation (Supplement VI).

Pursuant to the provisions of 10 CFR 2.201, Technion, Inc. is hereby required to submit a written statement or explanation to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, ATTN: Document Control Desk, Washington, D.C. 20555, with a copy to the Regional Administrator, Region I, within 30 days of the date of the letter transmitting this Notice of Violation (Notice). This reply should be clearly marked as a "Reply to a Notice of Violation" and should include for each violation: (1) the reason for the violation, or, if contested, the basis for disputing the violation, (2) the corrective steps that have been taken and the results achieved, (3) the corrective steps that will be taken to avoid further violations, and (4) the date when full compliance will be achieved. If an adequate reply is not received within the time specified in this Notice, an order or a Demand for Information may be issued to show cause why the license should not be modified, suspended, or revoked, or why such other action as may be proper should not be taken. Where good cause is shown, consideration will be given to extending the response time.

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
