Dear Sir or Madam:

This letter is to inform you of the status of Boston University's efforts to meet the financial assurance for decommissioning requirements with respect to the facilities covered by the above-referenced licenses.

I have written to the NRC previously, by letters dated July 26, 1990, and August 3, 1990, both addressed to the Document Control Desk, U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, 11555 Rockville Pike, Rockville, Maryland, to request extensions of time to meet the financial assurance requirements. I have recently received a letter from Maurice Messier of the License Fee and Debt Collection Branch, a copy of which is enclosed, requesting a \$290 fee in connection with my July 26 letter.

With regard to the fee, I believe it has already been paid. By letter dated July 25, 1990, a copy of which is also enclosed, William McNary, Jr. forwarded the \$290 amendment fee with specific reference to the decommissioning requirements. His letter pertains to the amendment of license #20-02215-01, which is held in the name of Boston University Medical Center. The other license referenced above (20-00805-11) is held in the name of Boston University, which is a non-profit organization and as such is, I understand, exempt from such fees. If I am mistaken with regard to the required fees in connection with either of the above licenses, please let me know as soon as possible.



With regard to the financial assurance for decommissioning requirement, the University intends to set up two escrow accounts at the First National Bank of Boston, one for each of the two licenses, and each in the amount of \$750,000. The form of escrow account will follow closely the form provided in Regulatory Guide 3.66. However, due to some unanticipated logistical problems I do not anticipate that the University will be able to actually set up those accounts until sometime next month. Therefore we expect to submit the required certification by October 26, 1990.

Dear Sir or Madam:

By letter dated July 26, 1990, I advised you that Boston University would be unable to meet the July 27, 1990 deadline for compliance with the regulations regarding certification of financial assurance for decommissioning (10 C.F.R. §30.35), and informed you that we expected to submit the required certification within 14 days of the deadline - by August 10, 1990.

We have determined that an escrow agreement will be the method to be used by the University in meeting the financial assurance requirements, and will select one of two major Boston area banks as escrow agent. I have been working with University officials responsible for the University's finances to set up such an escrow account in accordance with the applicable regulations and Regulatory Guide 3.66. Because of overlapping summer vacation schedules, however, we have been unable to finalize the escrow agreement and deposit the necessary funds within the time frame indicated in my earlier letter. Accordingly, I am now writing to inform you that we now expect to submit the required certification no later than September 14, 1990.

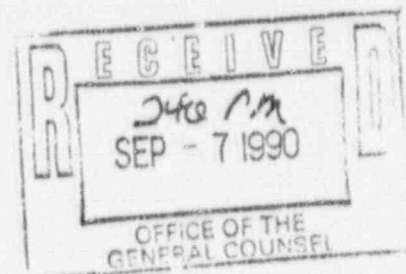

This refers to your letter dated July 26, 1990, requesting an exemption from the requirements of the decommissioning rule.

Your request will be considered as an amendment to Materials License 20-02115-01, for which an amendment fee of \$290 is required as specified in fee Category 7A of §170.31, 10 CFR 170, which went into effect July 2, 1990. A copy of the May 23, 1990, Federal Register notice regarding the revision to the Commission's fee regulations is enclosed. b. Decrease possession limit for C-14 to 500 millicuries.

c. Decrease possession limit for atomic number 82 to 500 millicuries.

Our Medical Center is and will be expanding space with the addition of new research buildings. In addition because of the increasing use of certain isotopes for molecular biology, we need to increase the possession limits for the following isotopes:

a. Increase S-35 from 1 Curie to 3 Curies

b. Increase I-125 from 1 Curie to 2 Curies

4) Please delete the requirement to obtain 10 uCi as lowest quarterly linearity dosage on the dose calibrator. Replace this with the lowest administered dose to a patient in Nuclear Medicine which is 50 uCi. This will relieve us of having to increase technician exposure and the time to perform this test for a dosage that appears to have no clinical relevance.

5) We ask that condition 20 of our license i.e. possession limit of NUREG 0767 be substituted with possession limits of 10 CFR 30.72

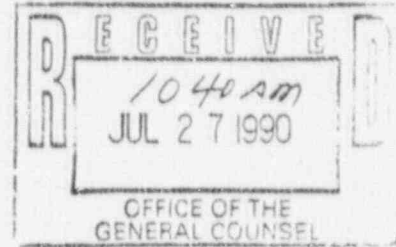

c) Possession Limits: Because of the decommissioning fund rule, we have reevaluated our possession limits.

a. Decrease possession limit for I-131 to 500 millicuries.

Dear Sir or Madam:

Boston University is the holder of licenses No. 20-00805-11 (Charles River Campus) and 20-02115-01 (Boston University Medical Center) for the use of nuclear byproduct material. These licenses cover the use of radioactive materials in academic and medical research as well as, in the case of the Medical Center, in patient care. Under regulations at 10 C.F.R. § 30.35, the University is required on or before July 27 to file a certification of financial assurance for decommissioning regarding each of these licenses.

Please be advised that Boston University will be unable to meet the July 27 filing deadline but expects to submit its certifications soon thereafter. Because this is the first time existing license holders have been required to file under these regulations, we have experienced some difficulty in interpreting the available forms of financial assurance, particularly as they apply to nonprofit, private universities.

We are attempting to obtain appropriate financial assurance as soon as possible and expect to submit our certifications within the next fourteen days.
