NOTICE OF VIOLATION

As a result of the inspection conducted on December 17, 1982, and in accordance with the NRC Enforcement Policy 10 CFR Part 2, Appendix C, the following violations were identified:

- A. License Condition 12, states that licensed materials shall be utilized for the purposes indicated by or under the supervision of certain named individuals.

Contrary to the above requirement, on October 16, 19, 20 and 21 of 1982, a physician not named on the license, utilized licensed radioactive materials .

This is a Severity Level IV Violation (Supplement VI).

- B. License Condition 19, states that the licensee shall possess and utilize licensed materials in accordance with statements, representations and procedures contained in applications dated October 2, 1978 and April 4, 1979 and letters dated April 4, 1979 and December 6, 1979. The October 2, 1978 application, Item 15, states that, "personnel shall wear personnel monitoring devices (film badges or TLD's) at all times while in areas where radioactive materials are used or stored."

Contrary to the above requirement, a physician, who utilized licensed radioactive materials on October 16, 19, 20, and 21 of 1982, was not provided personnel dosimetry.

This is a Severity Level IV Violation (Supplement VI).

Pursuant to the provisions of 10 CFR 2.201, Saint Francis Hospital is hereby required to submit to this office within thirty days of the date of this Notice, a written statement or explanation in reply, including: (1) the corrective steps which have been taken and the results achieved; (2) corrective steps which will be taken to avoid further items of noncompliance; and (3) the date when full compliance will be achieved. Consideration may be given to extending your response item for good cause shown.
