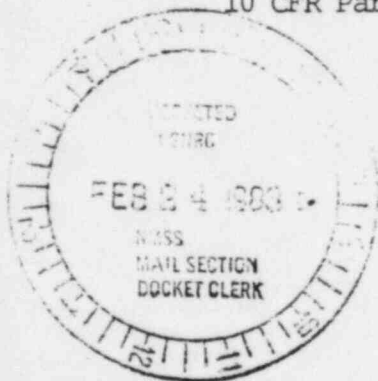


Personally appeared before me, the undersigned notary public, JACK D. ROLLINS, who being duly sworn according to law, deposes and says on oath as follows:

- (i) has been held in confidence by GNS;
- (ii) is of a type customarily held in confidence by GNS;
- (iii) is herewith transmitted to the NRC in confidence;
- (iv) is not available in public sources; and
- (v) if publicly disclosed whereby the information could be easily acquired or duplicated by others would cause substantial harm to the competitive position of GNS on account of the value of the information; and the amount of effort and money expended by GNS in developing the information.
