NOTICE OF VIOLATION

Sawyer Research Products, Inc.

License No. 34-02044-01

As a result of the inspection conducted on March 9, 1983, and in accordance with the NRC Enforcement Policy, 47 FR 9987 (March 9, 1982), the following violations were identified:

1. License Condition No. 16 requires that licensed material be possessed and used in accordance with statements, representations, and procedures contained in application attached to letter dated November 21, 1979, and other various dated letters.

Letter dated December 1, 1981, transmitted a revised Section G, Part I of your Radiography Policy and Procedures Manual. Section G, Part I, Item C, of this manual requires monthly audits of radiographic operations to be performed by the Chief Radiographer.

Contrary to this requirement, it was learned from statements of licensee representatives, that monthly audits of radiographic operations have not been performed. Specifically, audits of radiographic operations were performed on only five occasions since January 1982.

This is a Severity Level IV violation (Supplement VI).

2. License Condition No. 16 requires that licensed material be possessed and used in accordance with statements, representations, and procedures contained in application attached to letter dated November 21, 1979, and other various dated letters.


Letter dated December 1, 1981 transmitted a revised Section F, Part I of your Radiography Policy and Procedures Manual. Section F, Part I, page F-2, of this manual requires that annual written proficiency examinations be given to radiographers and radiographers assistants.

Contrary to this requirement, proficiency examinations have not been given annually. Specifically, no proficiency examination was given in 1982.

This is a Severity Level IV violation (Supplement VI).

Pursuant to the provisions of 10 CFR 2.201, you are required to submit to this office within thirty days of the date of this Notice a written statement or explanation in reply, including for each item of noncompliance: (1) corrective action taken and the results achieved; (2) corrective action to be taken to avoid further noncompliance; and (3) the date when full compliance will be achieved. Consideration may be given to extending your response time for good cause shown.
