SUBJECT: REVIEW OF EMERGENCY RESPONSE FACILITIES

On January 9, 1991, A. T. Boland and W. H. Rankin of the Region II office conducted a review of the emergency response facilities at your Crystal River site. The review focused on the availability of workspace and communications for NRC personnel in the event an Agency response is warranted for an incident at your site.

Facility tours were conducted in the Control Room, Technical Support Center, Emergency Operations Facility, and Emergency News Center in order to identify current NRC resources as well as understand Crystal River's emergency organization and response philosophy. Concurrently, discussions were held with members of the emergency planning staff regarding NRC's response philosophy and ways of most efficiently integrating NRC response into your existing plans based upon your organization, space, and equipment capabilities.

The tours and discussions conducted revealed that no major changes had been made to the available NRC resources since the joint Florida Power Corporation and NRC exercise conducted in June 1989. During this exercise, the logistical arrangements as well as the NRC/licensee interface procedures were fully tested with no significant impediments identified. However, the recent review revealed two areas for licensee followup. These items are as follows:

1. The NRC multi-line telephone located at the main management table in the Technical Support Center experienced operability problems when used coincident with an identical unit located in the NRC Resident Inspector's Office. The difficulties appeared to be due to the existence of crossed lines or improper line designations and resulted in limiting the flexibility and intended use of the two telephones.
2. The reviewers were unable to fully confirm the communications and specific telephone numbers designated for NRC in the Emergency Operations Facility and the Emergency News Center. This was due to the fact that the facilities are used for routine training purposes, and the facility

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configuration diagrams containing the needed information were in the process of revision.

Licensee representatives indicated that correction of the TSC telephone problems and transmittal of updated facility diagrams including telephone numbers would be accomplished. Currently, these items remain open for completion.

We appreciate the cooperation of your staff in determining the most effective and efficient means to satisfy NRC's logistical and communications needs. We believe the modifications implemented in the past as well as those areas noted above will enhance our ability to work effectively with your staff in meeting our overall responsibilities during an emergency.
