
Dear Friends:

Dear Mr. McDade:

I am writing to urge that the exemptions of the U.S. Navy and the Department of Energy to Nuclear Regulatory Commission regulations be reviewed. The clandestine shipment of radioactive wastes poses a risk to the tens of thousands of people living in the states through which the shipments pass. The Navy and DOE should be subject to the NRC's requirement that states be ~~also~~ notified before nuclear wastes are shipped through them. The current shipment secrecy does not enhance security; if organizations such as Greenpeace can track the routes of the shipments, it stands to reason that terrorist organizations can with equal ease.
