FACILITY OPERATING LICENSE

The U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has issued Amendment No. 13 to the General Electric Company (the licensee) for Facility Operating License No. TR-1. The amendment revises the license of the General Electric Test Reactor (the facility) located in Vallecitos, California to delete the physical security requirements and the accountability requirements of the license for as long as fuel or fueled experiments are absent from the facility.

The licensee's filing, which has been handled by the Commission as an application for an amendment, complies with the standards and requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act), and the Commission's rules and regulation. The Commission has made appropriate findings as required by the Act and the Commission's rules and regulations in 10 CFR Chapter I, which are set forth in the license amendment. Prior public notice of this amendment was not required since the amendment does not involve a significant hazards consideration.

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The Commission has determined that the issuance of this amendment will not result in any significant environmental impact and that pursuant to 10 CFR §51.5(d)(4), an environmental impact statement, negative declaration or environmental impact appraisal need not be prepared in connection with issuance of this amendment.
