

We recognize that an unexpected and substantial burden has been placed on the Licensees and on the federal agencies and State and local governments affected by the Commission's May 5 order. Most if not all of these entities are parties to this proceeding. We believe it reasonable and necessary to grant the relief requested by the Licensees. The relief shall extend to all parties to this proceeding. Further, as authorized by the Commission's May 10 order, we are extending the deadline for us to issue our recommendations to the Commission by a corresponding amount of time.

We have reached this decision and issued this order without waiting for responses to Licensees' Motion because the shortage of time does not permit us to await responses. The result we reach here does not, we believe, prejudice any party.

Upon consideration of the foregoing and the entire record in this matter it is this 11th day of May, 1983

ORDERED

1. That the last day for filing proposed findings of fact and recommendations for the Commission is extended from May 27 to June 27, 1983.
2. That the date for this Board to submit its recommendations to the Commission is extended from July 29 to August 29, 1983
