SUBJECT: SAFEGUARDS EVALUATION REPORT: TWO APPLICATIONS DATED OCTOBER 1,
1994, REVISIONS TO FUNDAMENTAL NUCLEAR MATERIAL CONTROL PLAN

BACKGROUND

In two separate letters, both dated October 1, 1994, Westinghouse-Columbia submitted (as enclosures to the two letters) revisions to its Fundamental Nuclear Material Control (FNMC) Plan. One letter dealt with FNMC Plan changes submitted pursuant to 10 CFR 70.32(c), while the other pertained to changes being requested pursuant to 10 CFR 70.34. The actual revised pages to the FNMC Plan and the justification for the changes were included within the enclosures associated with the respective two letters. The changes submitted pursuant to § 70.34 require Nuclear Regulatory Commission approval prior to implementation.

DISCUSSION

The above mentioned changes pertain to Sections 5.1.1, and 5.2.1, and to Figure 5.1 of the licensee's FNMC Plan, and deal with a consolidation of physical inventory coordination responsibilities and the physical inventory requirements pertaining to a shutdown (and deactivated) portion of the facility. All changes and the associated revised pages to the FNMC Plan were found to be acceptable.

CATEGORICAL EXCLUSION

The staff has determined that the implementation of these FNMC Plan revisions will not adversely affect the public health and safety or the environment; nor the common defense and security; and are otherwise in the public interest. The provisions in 10 CFR 51.22(c)(12) cite an exclusion for safeguards plans and material accountability. Therefore, neither an Environmental Assessment nor an Environmental Impact Statement is necessary for this proposed action.

CONCLUSION/RECOMMENDATION

The staff concludes that the licensee's revised FNMC Plan contains appropriate and necessary commitments to satisfy the applicable MC&A regulations contained in 10 CFR 74.31. The staff further concludes that the revised FNMC Plan will have no adverse effect on the public health and safety or on the environment. Therefore, it is recommended that Safeguards License Condition SG-1.1 to Materials License SNM-1107 be revised to incorporate these FNMC Plan revisions.
