Gentlemen:

We have completed our review of the GA Technologies, "Fixed Site and Transportation Plan for the Protection of Special Nuclear Material of Moderate and Low Strategic Significance" which was submitted to us by your letter (696-4054) dated March 4, 1983 and subsequently amended by your letter (696-4061) dated March 17, 1983. We have determined that the plan, as amended, meets the fixed site and in-transit requirements of 10 CFR 73.67 for the protection of special nuclear material (SNM) of moderate and low strategic significance licensed under your License No. SNM-696, except as indicated below.

The plan does not commit to certain protection requirements for SNM during import. We have determined that a commitment to meet these requirements should be expressed explicitly. License conditions which provide such a commitment have, therefore, been discussed and were agreed upon during a March 28, 1983 telephone conversation between you and Mr. Carlson of my staff.

Accordingly, we are revising Materials and Plant Protection Amendment MPP-1 to your License No. SNM-696 by adding Section 12.0, to read as follows, effective within 30 days of receipt of this letter.

12.0 PHYSICAL PROTECTION REQUIREMENTS FOR SPECIAL NUCLEAR MATERIAL OF MODERATE AND LOW STRATEGIC SIGNIFICANCE

12.1 The licensee shall maintain and fully implement all provisions of the Commission approved Physical Security Plan, including changes made pursuant to the authority of 10 CFR 70.32(e). The approved security plan consists of a GA Technologies, Inc. document, withheld from public disclosure pursuant

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to 10 CFR 73.21, entitled, "Fixed Site and Transportation Plan for the Protection of Special Nuclear Material of Moderate and Low Strategic Significance," dated February 1983, as amended by letter dated March 17, 1983.

- 12.2 In the event GA Technologies, Inc. plans to import and assume responsibility for SNM of moderate strategic significance they shall amend their plan and provide NRC with the measures to be used to protect the material in accordance with 10 CFR 73.67(e)(6), 120 days prior to the proposed shipping date.
- 12.3 In the event GA Technologies, Inc. plans to import and assume responsibility for SNM of low strategic significance they shall amend their plan and provide NRC with the measures to be used to protect the material in accordance with 10 CFR 73.67(g)(5), 120 days prior to the proposed shipping date.

Please note that documents other than those specified in License Condition 12.1, which were submitted pursuant to, or which related to, the requirements of 10 CFR 73.67(c)(1) are now obsolete and upon implementation of the approved plan are not considered part of your license.
