Following are comments concerning DRAFT REGULATORY GUIDE DG-0005 -
APPLICATIONS FOR LICENSES OF BROAD SCOPE.

1. Each authorization issued under the broad license should have a definite expiration date, or a commitment from the user to notify the RSO upon completion of the project. The licensee should at that time account for all radioactive materials received by the user, dispose of all waste radioactive materials and make sure that use areas are decontaminated and released, or controlled as necessary. All laboratory glassware and other equipment should be monitored and controlled or released as appropriate.
2. There have been regulatory problems with generation and storage of radioactive (mixed) waste at "satellite" laboratories and then transfer to a central location for storage and decay (or disposal). The transport of these wastes must meet all DOT requirements, as well as applicable hazardous waste regulations, and any applicable local jurisdiction requirements.
