You, Jesse L. Whitlock, have been appointed Radiation Safety Officer for Mercy Hospital - Springfield and are responsible for ensuring the safe and secure use of radiation and radioactive material. You are responsible for managing the radiation protection program; identifying radiation protection problems; initiating. recommending, or providing corrective actions; verifying implementation of corrective actions; stopping unsafe activities; and ensuring compliance with regulations. You are hereby delegated the authority and resources necessary to meet those responsibilities, including prohibiting the use of byproduct material or radiation emitting devices by individual(s) who do not meet the necessary requirements. You have the authority to shut down or alter operations and activities that are determined by you to be unsafe or in violation of radiation safety regulatory or accreditation requirements. You are required to notify management of situations where staff are not cooperating, complying or addressing radiation safety policies or issues. In addition, you are free to contact the Nuclear Regulatory Commission or the Missouri Radiation Control Program with issues or concerns at any time. It is estimated that you will spend at least 20 hours per week conducting radiation protection activities.
