SUBJECT: PROPOSED LICENSE TO EXPORT COMPONENTS TO SWEDEN (XCOM0848)

On January 23, 1984, Westinghouse Electric Corporation applied for a license to export 100 pieces of zirconium tubing to Sweden's ASEA-ATOM for fabrication into nuclear fuel assemblies for ultimate use in a U.S. BWR power reactor. Westinghouse has requested that the license application be expedited in order for the tubing to be exported immediately as production delays have resulted at ASEA-ATOM.

The staff has concluded that the proposed export meets the requirements of the Atomic Energy Act, as amended, and would not be inimical to the common defense and security of the United States.

In view of the above considerations, the staff issued the license without the normal 15-day waiting period.
