Dear Mr. Schoenberger:

This letter responds to Mr. Parris's letter of May 13, 1983 and your letter of June 13, 1983 on behalf of the Rockland County Legislature to the Directors of the Offices of Nuclear Reactor Regulation, Nuclear Material Safety and Safeguards, and Inspection and Enforcement requesting that action be taken pursuant to section 2.206 of the Commission's regulations regarding the Indian Point Station, Units 2 and 3. The request was brought pursuant to Resolution No. 302, passed by the Rockland County Legislature on April 19, 1983, which sought immediate suspension of operations at Indian Point, and other relief related to the findings of emergency planning deficiencies at Indian Point identified by the Federal Emergency Management Agency. The Resolution was considered pursuant to section 2.206.

For the reasons stated in the enclosed "Director's Decision under 10 C.F.R. 2.206", the Rockland County Legislature's request has been denied. That decision relies on the Commission's order of June 10, 1983, a copy of which is enclosed for your reference.

A copy of the decision will be filed with the Secretary for the Commission's review in accordance with 10 C.F.R. 2.206(c). As provided in 10 C.F.R. 2.206(c), the Director's Decision will become the final action of the Commission in twenty-five (25) days, unless the Commission determines to review it within that time.

I have also enclosed a copy of a notice that is being filed with the Office of the Federal Register for publication.
