Dear Administrative Judges:

III. NRC STAFF STATEMENT OF THE ISSUES

In order to simplify the proceeding and to clarify the specific issues to be decided by the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board (Board), the NRC Staff has developed a statement of issues to be litigated, as set out below. Although no agreement was reached between the parties as to a joint stipulation of facts and statement of issues, the several discussions held between the parties indicated there should be no disagreement as to the issues to be decided by the Board.

The Staff believes that the following issues are to be decided by the Board, after presentation of evidence by the parties.

- 1. Whether, on September 18, 1992, during the day shift in the control room of the Dresden Nuclear Station, Unit 2, Mr. Pierce agreed with Messrs. Sean Miller, David Tang Wee, John Marotto and George Piccard, not to report the mispositioning of rod H-1 to senior management at the Dresden plant, in violation of 10 C.F.R. § 50.5?
- 2. Whether, during a transcribed interview by the NRC Office of Investigations on November 30, 1992, Mr. Pierce failed to provide complete and accurate information in all material respects, in violation of 10 C.F.R. § 55.9, when he stated he did not remember a conversation with Messrs. Miller, Marotto, Piccard, and Tang Wee in the Dresden Unit 2 control room on September 18, 1992, in which Mr. Tang Wee instructed them that information concerning the mispositioned rod would not leave the control room?

 $^{^1\}text{The Office of Enforcement}$ has informed Staff Counsel that the statement concerning the falsification of Dresden Form 14-14c, in the April 21, 1994 Order issued to Mr. Pierce, in Part II, ¶ 2, is not, and was not intended to be, an allegation against Mr. Pierce. The statement was included only as another event which occurred, which is not an element of the action taken against Mr. Pierce.

3. If the Board finds in the affirmative on issues one and two, the Board must then decide whether the Order should be sustained, as set forth in Part V, \P 2 of the "Order Prohibiting Involvement in NRC-Licensed Activities (Effective Immediately)" issued to Mr. Pierce on April 21, 1994.
