This is an update to a previous report submitted June 7, 1983, for the following event. On April 24, 1983, smoke detectors in the upper and lower cable spreading rooms of the Control Building were covered and deactivated to prevent inadvertent actuation from welding activities. Action (b) of Technical Specification 3.3.7.9 was entered as part of the planned activity.

All smoke detectors associated with Special Report 83-041 were restored to operability by September 6, 1983. Since the smoke detectors were not restored within 14 days, this is submitted as a Special Report pursuant to Technical Specification 6.9.2. This condition had no effect on the health and safety of the public and did not constitute a threat to plant safety. This is a final report.
