With both nuclear units in operation, the piant heating boiler was started up for training purposes. A blowdown sample was collected for analysis and found to contain 7.56 PPM iron. Inactivity of the boiler (last used October 23, 1983) is believed to have been the reason for the iron level.

The boiler was only in use for training a short time.
