The Atomic Safety and Licensing Board's Memorandum and Order Regarding Establishment of Hearing Schedule and Granting AWPP Motion to Compel Discovery (September 13, 1983) states a site visit is to be made after the prehearing conference scheduled to begin on October 17, 1983. In its order, the Board invited representatives of the parties to attend the site visit and stated that the parties shall coordinate any necessary arrangements for the site visit among themselves, not later than the first day of the prehearing conference.

I am requesting that, prior to the first session of the prehearing conference, the spokesman for the parties identify to me in writing the representative who will accompany the Board on the tour. Because of the physical limitations in certain parts of the facility, the number of individuals on the tour must be kept as limited as possible.

The following site rules apply to participants in the tour:


1. Site sign-in and badge procedures must be complied with.
2. No one under 18 years of age is permitted.
3. No high heeled or open toed shoes are permitted.
4. Women are required to wear slacks.
5. No cameras are permitted.

6. Hardhats, which will be issued upon your arrival at the site, must be worn at all times.
7. All representatives accompanying the Licensing Board must remain with the escorted group and not interfere with or interrupt ongoing work.
8. Safety glasses and hearing protection must be worn in posted areas; they will be issued, as necessary.
