Management Actions Taken

Drug and alcohol testing results for the reporting period are described in Attachment 1.

All contractor employees testing positive for drugs/alcohol were denied access to the Protected Area. Pursuant to Plant Administrative Procedure (PAP-0224) "Fitness For Duty" requirements, individuals and/or their company representatives were informed of the right to appeal, and of the procedural requirements in order to re-establish unescorted access to the Protected Area. To date, none of these individuals have initiated steps to resolve this matter.

Three individuals were subjected to unannounced follow-up testing during this reporting period, as a result of Fitness-For-Duty Program concerns.

Reported Events

In accordance with 10CFR26, Appendix A, 2.8(e)(4), an unsatisfactory performance test result was identified on September 12, 1994, and was reported on February 23, 1995 by Letter PY-CEI/NRR-1913L. This test was performed by a Department of Health and Human Service (HHS) certified laboratory. Results of this investigation and corrective actions taken are contained in the above cited letter.
