Lancaster hereby opposes the decision of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission made on January 27, 1984, to separate management issues from the Three Mile Island Unit 1 reactor restart decision and, by copy of this Resolution, requests the Nuclear Regulatory Commission to reconsider their decision.
