FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT REQUEST

To whom it may concern:

Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. 522, as amended, the Nuclear Information and Resource Service requests the following documents regarding the replacement of piping at the Nine Mile Point, Unit 1. Please consider "documents" to include reports, studies, test results, correspondence, memoranda, meeting notes, meeting minutes, working papers, graphs, charts, diagrams, notes and summaries of conversations and interviews, computer records, and any other forms of written communication, including internal NRC Staff memoranda. The documents are specifically requested from, but not limited to, the following offices of the NRC: Office of the Analysis and Evaluation of Operational Data (AEOD); Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation (NRR); Office of Nuclear Regulatory Research (Research); Office of Inspection and Enforcement (I&E); Generic Issues Branch of the Division of Safety Technology, NRR; and the Operating Reactors Branches of the Division of Licensing. In your response, please identify which documents correspond to which requests below.

Pursuant to this request, please provide all documents prepared or utilized by, in the possession of, or routed through the NRC regarding:

1. The ALARA (As Low As Reasonably Achievable) program as proposed and implemented, or not implemented, by Niagara Mohawk Power Company during the replacement, including any analyses of it; and
2. NRC's knowledge and/or analysis of the time required for the replacement including, but not limited to, possible errors made in the removal and cutting of piping, problems caused by the sequencing and scheduling of work, qualifications of the work force performing the replacement, and utility management planning for the replacement.

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In our opinion, it is appropriate in this case for you to waive copying and search charges, pursuant to 5 U.S.C. 552(a)(4)(A) "because furnishing the information can be considered as primarily benefiting the general public." The Nuclear Information and Resource Service is a non-profit organization serving local organizations concerned about nuclear power and providing information to the general public.
