Gentlemen:

As stated in our letter to you on this subject, dated January 14, 1982, the revised emergency planning rule published August 19, 1980, requires that emergency preparedness be upgraded and maintained at and around nuclear power plants. Part of the maintenance process is a requirement for periodic exercises, some of which must be conducted before a full power operating license decision is made. The NRC will provide inspectors to observe the onsite aspects of these exercises and will review the proposed scenarios.

The NRC will review the proposed scenarios for adequacy in terms of scope (testing of major areas of response) and adequacy of provisions enabling testing of major portions of offsite plans. In order to ensure proper review and coordination with all the participant organizations, a timely submittal of information is required. Unfortunately, many applicants and licensees have been negligent in providing timely submittals in the past. The following scenario submission schedule is necessary:
