Alrworthinesa Directives; Boeing Model 727 Series Airplanes

AGENCY: Faderal Aviation. Administration, DDT.

ACTION: Notice of proposed rulemaking (NPRM).

SUMMARY: This document proposes the supersedure of an existing airworthiness directive (AD), applicable to all Model 727 series airplanes, that currently requires repetitive inspections to detect cracks in the slat track roller bearing bolts, and replacement, if necessary This action would add an inspection of the positional plates installed on certain airplanes, and replacement, if necessary; reduce the compliance time for the initial inspection; and cite the latest revision to the service bulletin as the appropriate service information source. This proposal is prompted by a report that certain positional plates may not stop rotation of the roller bearing bolts. The actions specified by the proposed AD are intended to prevent jamming of the affected slat or separation of the slat from the airplane.
