The Commission met in open session, pursuant to notice, at 8:15 a.m., the Honorable KENNETH M. CARR, Chairman of the Commission, presiding.

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PROCEEDINGS

(11:31 a.m.)

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CHAIRMAN CARR: Good morning, ladies and gentlemen. This is an affirmation session. We have four items to come before us this morning.

Before I ask the Secretary to lead us through the items for affirmation. do any of my fellow Commissioners have any opening comments they would like to make?

(No response.)

If not, Mr. Secretary, you may proceed.

MR. CHILK: Thank you.

The first item on the agenda, Mr. Chairman, is SECY 91-165, Emergency Response Data System.

The Commission is being asked to approve a final rule to require licensees of all operating nuclear power facilities. except Big Rock Point, to participate in the Emergency Response Data System program.

Chairman Carr and Commissioners Rogers and Curtiss have approved the final rule. Commissioner Remick has disapproved the rule: he does not believe that the cost to implement the ERDS is justified when balanced against the potential increase in the overall protection of the public health and safety, and would prefer to gain additional experience with ERDS through voluntary participation.

Would you please affirm your vote?

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(Chorus of ayes.)

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MR. CHILK: The second item is SECY 91-150, Proposed Amendments to 10 CFR Part 21, "Reporting of Defects and Non-compliance" and 10 CFR 50.55(e), "Conditions of Construction Permits".

The Commission is being asked to approve final amendments to 10 CFR Parts 21 and 50.55(e) that clarify the criteria and procedures for the reporting of safety defects by licensees and non-licensees and to reduce duplicate reporting.

Commissioners Rogers, Curtiss, and Remick have approved the final rule with changes as recommended by Commissioner Remick. chairman Carr did not participate in this action.

Would you please affirm your vote? (Chorus of ayes.)

MR. CHILK: The third item is a Final Rule on Nuclear Power License Renewal.

The Commission is being asked to act on a final rule for nuclear power plant license renewal.

Chairman Carr and Commissioners Rogers, Remick, and Curtiss have approved a delegation of authority under the Reorganization Plan No. 1 of 1980 and 10 CFR Section 1.31(c) which authorizes the EDO to prepare and issue a final license renewal rule, attached to our memorandum of

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June 27. The delegation specifies that the final rule shall contain:

- (1) the staff's proposed alternative 1 to compiling the documents that establish the current licensing basis; and
- the structures, systems, and components (2) important to license renewal, as defined in 10 CFR 54.3. should include (i) as proposed in SECY 91-138; (ii) as proposed by Commissioner Remick; and parts (iii) and (iv) as proposed by Chairman Carr. Part (iii) includes all SSCs relied on in safety analyses or plant evaluations to demonstrate compliance with the Commission's regulations for fire protection, environmental qualification, pressurized thermal shock, anticipated transients without scram, and station blackout; part (1v) includes all SSCs subject to operability requirements contained in the facility technical specification Limiting Conditions for Operation.

Commissioner Remick approved the rule but would not have broadened the definition to include all SSCs subject to operability requirements contained in the facility technical specifications limiting conditions for

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1 operation.

The delegation directs the EDO to carefully review the entire renewal rule package and make revisions as appropriate, to ensure consistency of the entire rule package.

following completion of the revisions, the Commission will be provided a copy of the Federal Register notice for information and the EDO is authorized to issue the rule.

Would you please affirm your vote?

(Chorus of ayes.)

MR CHILK: The fourth item is SECY 91-110, the Staff Evaluation and Recommendation on Maintenance Rulemaking.

The Commission is being asked to address a staff recommendation to issue a final maintenance policy statement and revise the Commission enforcement policy to delete the maintenance escalation factor.

All Commissioners have agreed to delete the maintenance escalation factor in 10 CFR Part 2.

Chairman Carr and Commissioners Rogers and Curtiss have disapproved the staff's recommendation to adopt a final policy statement and have agreed to issue a final rule. The rule, attached to our memorandum, provides a framework for evaluating the effectiveness of licensees maintenance

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programs by requiring licensees to monitor the performance or conditions of key structures systems, and components against licensee-established goals, in a manner sufficient to provide reasonable assurance that those SSCs will be capable of performing their intended functions. Where monitoring proves to be unnecessary, licensees would be permitted the option of relying upon an appropriate preventive maintenance program, such as reliability-centered maintenance. Once a program is established, a licensee will be required to evaluate the program on an annual basis, taking into account industry-wide operating experience and, second, to adjust the program where necessary to ensure that the objective of preventing failures is appropriately balanced against the objective of minimizing the unavailability of SSCs.

Commissioner Remick approved the staff's recommendation to issue a policy statement. He does not believe that there is a need for a rule in light of the significant improvements that have been made in licensee maintenance programs. He believes that this rule may interfere with licensee's efforts toward further improvement in maintenance. Further, he believes that the rule contains fundamental changes in direction likely to lead to implementation problems that the Commission may not be aware of now. He therefore strongly believes that the rule should

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1	be issued for public comment before it becomes final. His
2	dissenting views, as attached, will be published with the
3	Federal Register Notice.
