Subject: LICENSEE EMPLOYEES ARRESTED (PNO-I-83-113-UPDATE)

The two Duquesne Light Company (DLC) employees arrested on November 15, 1983 in connection with an earlier offsite altercation involving a local (Aliquippa, PA) man who subsequently died on November 14, 1983, were released on bail on November 16, and returned to their positions at the plant on November 17. Plant access was limited to the protected area excluding vital areas. On November 23, these employees were suspended indefinitely by DLC in accordance with a company practice of suspending employees that have been charged with a felony offense.

Local media interest has occurred. Neither the licensee nor NRC has issued a press release. Region I will respond to media inquiries. The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania has been informed.

Region I continues to receive updated information involving this situation via the resident inspector. This information is current as of 10:00 a.m., November 29, 1983.
