INFORMATION PROVIDED TO THE JCAE STAFF

In accordance with Mr. R. H. Engelken's memo of April 1, 1969, I called Mr. Radcliff on April 9, 1969, and informed him of the following:

1. Mr. Bauser was being informed separately of the status of the piping problem at the Jersey Central Power & Light Company's reactor facility. (As per R. H. Engelken, Mr. Price did discuss the problem with Mr. Bauser.)
2. The status of the N. S. SAVANNAH (NSS). He was told that the repair and test program was progressing satisfactorily and that no special problem had occurred.

I called Mr. Radcliff on April 22, 1969, for the purpose of fulfilling our commitment of keeping him informed on the status of the NSS. I told him that satisfactory repairs, verified by appropriate tests, had been completed and that our inspector had observed important phases of the repairs and the tests. The NSS sailed from Brooklyn, New York, to Norfolk, Virginia, on Sunday, April 20, 1969. I did not discuss the piping problem at the Jersey Central Power & Light Company's reactor facility.
