MEASUREMENT OF SPECIAL NUCLEAR MATERIAL CONTENT OF FUEL RODS

GE is now implementing a rather complete gamma scanning inspection program for all fuel rods. Based on a recent inspection of Westinghouse's fuel fabrication plant at Columbia, South Carolina, Westinghouse does not have such an inspection program - they rely on administrative controls.
