Enclosed is a copy of the final exercise report for the October 20, 1993, full participation plume exposure and ingestion pathway exercise of the offsite radiological emergency response plans, site-specific to the Diablo Canyon Power Plant. The State of California and the Counties of San Luis Obispo and Santa Barbara fully participated. The American Red Cross and Amateur Radio Emergency Services partially participated in the exercise. The final exercise report was prepared by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Region IX staff. A copy of the report will be provided to the State of California by the FEMA Region IX staff.

There were no Deficiencies identified during the exercise. There were, however, twenty-six Areas Requiring Corrective Action identified. FEMA Region IX staff will monitor the status of corrective actions.


