

9/21/91 Project Manager Allegation Alcohol Referred to EAP and put on an accelerated Follow Up Monitoring Program.

10/11/91 None Known Found during routine surveillance of Protected Area on a metal ledge behind a duct Marijuana Cigarette Butt After a thorough investigation, it was concluded that the substance had been lying in the area where it was located for a very long time.

10/31/91 Acting Foreman Allegation Alcohol Individual was acting foreman at the time of the allegation. This was handled as a Reportable Incident. Further investigation indicates that this should have been a Non Reportable Incident. Therefore, IP is downgrading this incident to a Non Reportable Incident. The individual is now on a company Follow Up Monitoring Program.

MANAGEMENT ACTIONS

Our Quality Assurance Audit completed in November 1991 indicated no weaknesses in our FPD program. Some strengths observed were that all procedures and protocols for onsite lab testing for alcohol and illegal drugs conformed to 10CFR26 requirements. All blind performance tests and random testing are being done meeting requirements of percentage and selection for testing.

* Clinton Power tests all site employees with or without unescorted access. The Average Site Population for Clinton in 1991 was 1600 employees.

** Those placed on a monitoring program per the Medical Review Officers recommendation due to background information and personal interviews by the MRO during entrance processing.
