Dear Congressman Montgomery:

In response to your letter of May 14, 1984, let me assure you that the NRC staff is doing everything appropriate to resolve the outstanding issues on Grand Gulf, Unit 1 in a timely manner. Currently, there are two major licensing issues to resolve; (1) Technical Specifications and (2) Transamerica Delaval, Inc. (TDI) diesel generators. We will proceed with the consideration of a full-power license when the review of these issues is completed.

In regard to the Technical Specifications, the licensee performed an extensive review of their Technical Specifications starting on March 2, 1984, and has identified over 400 problem areas which will require on the order of 150 changes to the Technical Specifications. During this effort, the staff has met frequently with the licensee to resolve the problem areas and determine the acceptability of proposed changes. At this time, we anticipate completion of this effort by mid-July 1984.

In regard to the TDI diesel generators, we have recently issued an Order dated May 22, 1984 (Enclosure) which requires the disassembly and inspection of the Division 1 diesel engine. The previous disassembly and inspections, noted in your letter, were evaluated by the staff as incomplete and insufficient to establish the reliability of the TDI engines. Included in the Order are interim Technical Specifications addressing the gas turbines. The Order allows Grand Gulf, Unit 1, to continue at low power while performing the engine inspection. The Order was issued because we consider it necessary to obtain this important information to establish the reliability of the TDI diesel generators at Grand Gulf. The licensee has stated that the TDI diesel engine inspection which started on May 24, 1984, will take from 6 to 8 weeks.

With respect to the portable gas turbines, we have given some credit in the Order for their presence to enhance the onsite power supply system. By themselves, they cannot fully take the place of a TDI diesel generator since they are not qualified as safety grade equipment and their startup time is fairly long, 22 minutes versus 10 seconds for the TDI. The interim Technical Specifications included in the Order require the gas turbines to be in operation under severe weather conditions to compensate for this prolonged startup period. We find this situation acceptable for continued operation at low power (5%).

The licensee recently notified us of a design deficiency in the Standby Service Water System that causes it to be unable to meet the regulatory requirements for long-term cooling following an accident. The licensee voluntarily placed the plant in a cold shutdown condition pending resolution of this deficiency. It is too early to predict whether the resolution of this deficiency will delay authorization for full-power operation.

We have worked closely with the licensee on the resolution of these matters and will continue to place high priority on our staff review efforts in order to minimize further delays.
