SUBJECT: SUPPLRY OF JUNE 17. 1980 MEETING ON FIRE PROTECTION

On June 17, 1980, the NRC staff met briefly in Bethesda, Maryland with Consumers Power Company (CPCe) to discuss portions of the Fire Protection Evaluation Report, contained in Appendix 9A to the Midland FSAR as revised through FSAR Revision 28. Meeting attendees are listed by Enclosure 1.

Mr. R. Teuteberg of CPCs described the status of cable and conduit installation at the site and discussed the engineering re-routing analysis which was necessary. Mr. Teuteberg also described difficulties associated with compliance with Revision 2 to Regulatory Guide 1.75 separation criteria as presently endorsed by Branch Technical Position 9.5-1. The requirement for a 20 foot minimum separation distance between redundant safety channels is presenting some difficulty. The discussion of the source of the postulated fire was discussed and CPCo described its intent to assume a reasonable size fire for any given zone derived from estimates of the quantities of combustible material expected to be in that zone. The staff suggested that consideration be given to a two-gallon can of flammable liquid as a fire source. The staff provided references to several related matters on recent OL plants, including questions on San C.ofre 253, and SERs for North Anna, Sequelyah, Farley and Zimmer.

The staff noted that the one-in-ten year natural phenomena discussed in BTP 9.5-1 is not applicable to the Midland class of plant.

CPGs also inquired about the staff's schedule for resumption of the fire protection review for the Midland plant. The staff replied that review schedules based upon all near term review efforts were presently being developed and that the schedule for Midland will be developed as part of this integrated scheduling effort scheduled for completion in late summer of 1980.
