SUBJECT: NRC INSPECTION REPORT NO. 50-302/92-01

This refers to the motor-operated valve inspection conducted by U. S. NRC Region II at your Crystal River facility from January 6-10, 1992. The inspection consisted of a review of the program you developed in response to Generic Letter 89-10, "Safety-Related Motor-Operated Valve Testing and Surveillance." Areas examined during the inspection are discussed in the enclosed inspection report.

At the conclusion of the inspection, the findings were discussed with those members of your staff identified in the report. It was determined that you had developed a program which adequately addresses most of the generic letter recommendations. However, some concerns were identified. As denoted in the Summary section of the enclosed inspection report, a written response is requested for two of the concerns. The first is that, based on the current status of your calculations, procedures to be revised, etc.; insufficient resources appeared to have been allocated to the program to ensure completion in accordance with the schedule specified by the generic letter. It was our inspectors' understanding that you had already recognized this and that you plan additional engineering support. The second concern is that your plans indicated a potential deviation from the generic letter recommendation (as explained in Supplement 1 to the generic letter) to design-basis test all valves practicable. Your previous written response to the generic letter, dated January 2, 1990, did not indicate that you would avoid testing any valves that were practicable to test. Please inform us in writing, within 60 days, of your planned actions and schedule to address the two concerns.

In addition to the concerns described briefly above, the inspection identified a number of strengths as-well-as several concerns which did not require a response at this time. These concerns and strengths are listed in the inspection report Summary following the concerns for which the written response has been requested. All of the concerns are discussed in Section 3 of the inspection report.
