SUBJECT: NOTICE OF VIOLATION

(NRC INSPECTION REPORT NOS. 50-325/92-01 AND 50-324/92-01)

This refers to the inspection conducted by Richard L. Prevatte of this office on January 4-31, February 3, 1992. The inspection included a review of activities authorized for your Brunswick facility. At the conclusion of the inspection, the findings were discussed with those members of your staff identified in the enclosed inspection report.

Areas examined during the inspection are identified in the report. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of selective examinations of procedures and representative records, interviews with personnel, and observation of activities in progress.

Based on the results of this inspection, one apparent violation (50-325,324/92-01-01) was identified and is being considered for escalated enforcement action in accordance with the "General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions" (Enforcement Policy), 10 CFR Part 2, Appendix C (1991). The apparent violation concerns the use of an inadequate procedure during cleaning activities on emergency diesel generator (EDG) 2 which resulted in the failure of the EDG to start on demand. This apparent violation is of added concern because it depicts a number of fundamental breakdowns in your work control process. Accordingly, so Notice of Violation is presently being issued for these inspection findings. Please be advised that the number and characterization of apparent violations described in the enclosed inspection report may change as a result of further NRC review.

An enforcement conference to discuss this apparent violation has been scheduled for March 3, 1992. The purposes of this conference are to discuss the apparent violation, its cause and safety significance; to provide an opportunity for you to present your proposed corrective action(s); and to discuss any other information that will help us determine the appropriate

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enforcement action in accordance with the Enforcement Policy. You will be advised by separate correspondence of the results of our deliberations on this matter. No response regarding the apparent violation is r quired at this time.

In accordance with 10 CFR $2.7^{\rm A}$, of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," a copy of this letter and its enclosures will be placed in the NRC Public Document Room.

The response directed by this letter is not subject to the clearance procedures of the Office of Management and Budget as required by the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1980, Pub. L. No. 96-511.
