SUBJECT: SER INPUT FOR GINNA RESTART

We have reviewed the emergency preparedness items and findings regarding the steam generator tube rupture at the R.E. Ginna Nuclear Power Plant on January 25, 1982. The major documents used in our review included the incident evaluation, dated April 12, 1982, submitted by the licensee, and the NER report NUREG-0909, dated April 1982. This will also serve to respond to your April 5, 1982, memorandum from the Assistant Director for Safety Assessment, DOL.

We found that no new deficiencies were indicated as a result of the incident that were not previously identified in the Ginna Emergency Preparedness Evaluation Report (EPER) dated March 1982 copy enclosed. In fact, the incident reinforced certain previous findings regarding:

- 1) Emergency Action Levels for event classification.
- 2) Shift staffing requirements for emergencies.
- 3) Centralized reporting for field monitoring data.
- 4) Alternate evacuation routes and relocation centers.

These deficiencies which are addressed in more detail in the attached EPER will require correction consistent with the schedule set forth in the forthcoming Emergency Preparedness Appraisal Report to be issued by Region I. From an emergency preparedness standpoint, we consider that the plant can restart at this time and continue operations.
