This will confirm my telephone conversation with each of you this morning regarding compliance with the Licensing Board's "Order Requiring Submission of Joint Schedule Proposal for Offsite Emergency Planning Matters," dated July 23, 1984. At that time, I proposed on behalf of the Applicant that the parties' representatives meet in conference at 10 a.m. in Philadelphia on Wednesday, August 1, 1984 to discuss and attempt to agree upon a schedule for further prehearing matters and commencement of the evidentiary hearing on emergency planning contentions, as required by the Licensing Board. Each of you agreed to this proposal. Miss Ferkin noted that she would be out of town for three days that week and suggested that, rather than delay the meeting to which the others had agreed, she would submit a

draft schedule in advance of the meeting and comment upon the group's proposal upon her return next Thursday.

In order to comply with the Licensing Board's order and to make the meeting as efficient and productive as possible, each of the parties should give detailed consideration to each of the points raised by the Board in its July 23 and April 20, 1984 orders as well as any other particular prehearing matter which it wants the Board to consider. This should include a schedule with tentative dates for each item leading up to and including commencement of the evidentiary hearing.

As I mentioned this morning, I will call you shortly when the place of the meeting has been designated. In the meantime, I will be contacting FEMA to obtain input from its representative.
