SUBJECT: CHANGE REQUEST 195/60 - DIFFERENTIAL TEMPERATURE REQUIREMENTS FELATED TO STARTING REACTOR COOLING PUMPS (TAC NOS. M82303 AND M82304)

By letter dated January 13, 1992, Duquesne Light Company submitted proposed changes to the Beaver Valley Power Station, Units 1 and 2 Technical Specifications (TS). The proposed amendments would modify a footnote to Limiting Condition for Operation (LCO) 3.4.1.6 (Units 1 and 2) to permit the starting of an idle reactor coolant pump (RCP) without first determining the differential temperature across the steam generators if at least one RCP is operating. For Unit 1 only, the proposed amendment also would add LCO 3.4.1.7 and Surveillance Requirement (SR) 4.4.1.7.1 to ensure that * differential temperature requirement is applicable when starting the first RCP. A similar LCO and SR is already incorporated in the Unit 2 1S.

We have reviewed the material presented in your application. We have determined that you have not presented any technical __stification and support for the staff to perform an evaluation of the merits and acceptability of your proposal. Therefore, we request that you resubmit your application along with descriptions of the technical analyses performed and the results obtained to support the assertions made in your application. We do not plan further review of your January 13, 1992, application and our efforts under TAC Nos. M82303 and M82304 are completed.
