SUBJECT: NRC INSPECTION REPORT 50-482/91-13 (NOTICE OF VIOLATION)

This letter refers to the inspection conducted by Ms. L. L. Gundrum and Mr. W. B. Jones of this office during the period May 16 through June 26, 1991. The inspection included a review of activities authorized for your Wolf Creek Generating Station. At the conclusion of the inspection, the findings were discussed with those members of your staff identified in the enclosed report.

Areas examined during the inspection are identified in the report. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of selective examination of procedures and representative records, interviews with personnel, and observations of activities in progress.

On the basis of the results of this inspection, certain of your activities appeared to be in violation of MRC requirements, as specified in the enclosed Notice of Violation (Notice). 1.3 first violation pertains to a valve in the turbine driven auxiliary feedwater , amp discharge flow path that was not locked in accordance with the governing procedure (paragraph 3.2). This violation is of concern because two quality assurance surveillances were performed in May 1991 in the area of locked valves and did not identify the improperly installed locking device. One surveillance was intended to specifically verify that the locking device was properly installed. The other surveillance had identified three components where the locking device was not properly installed. This indicates that previous corrective actions to correct similar problems with the locked component program have not been completely effective. The second violation identified a failure to meet certain requirements of your fire protection program (paragraphs 4.1 and 4.2). This violation is of concern because an operability evaluation was delayed and appears to be indicative of a weakness in your policy and procedures for making prompt operability determinations, particularly for plant equipment that is not goverend by a specific Technical Specification. This violation is also indicative of weaknesses in implementing fire protection program surveillance requirements.

You are required to respond to this letter and should follow the instructions specified in the enclosed Notice when preparing your response. In your response, you should document the specific actions taken and any additional actions you plan to prevent recurrence. After reviewing your response to this
